OPEN PUBLIC DISCUSSION

Mayor Alviene opened the meeting to the public at this time.

Jack Brennan, on Behalf of the Butler Fire Department Exempt

Mr. Brennan wanted to let the Mayor and Council know that the Fire Department Exempt Department is desperately in need of funding; currently they exist solely on donations. The Exempt also put out over 200 flags for Memorial Day that are purchased by the Exempt Association to honor the deceased members. When a volunteer firefighter passes away, the Exempt Association provides a flag holder; there is a smaller version of the flag holder. At the Butler firehouse, each deceased member gets a plaque, the total outlay is between \$150.00 and \$170.00, this year alone seven members have passed away, and funding is at an all-time low. There are no extra funds, to provide for any refreshments at their meetings,

everything is bare bones. Mr. Brennan is looking for approximately \$500 to \$1,000.00, regarding prior funding by the Borough; Mr. Lampmann believes that funds may have been received from the Fire Prevention Budget, of which a former Butler Fire Chief was the Fire Official. Mayor Alviene noted that if accounting of funds is being conducted in a better manner then he does not see any reason for not providing funds to the Exempt Association. Mr. Lampmann asked what amount is needed to cover the remainder of the year, how much do you need. He reiterated how much money are you looking for so he can get an idea on how much money he needs to find. After discussion it was determined that funding in the amount of \$1,000.00 should be sufficient to cover the remainder of the year. Councilman Regis asked that they review what funding they would need on a yearly basis and submit this as part of the budget process.

Seeing no one else come forward to speak a motion was made to close the public portion of the meeting. Moved: Fox Second: McNear All in favor.

Mr. Lampmann noted that he received a list from Mr. Budesheim he received a list of properties that need cleaning up based on the list provided by a resident. Of the initial list of seventy-two properties, it was actually fifty-four properties of those six properties where actually in violation. Five of the six properties have already been issued summons, recently passed Borough legislation allows the Borough to place a lien on the property if the Borough needs to hire someone to clean up the property. Mr. Oostdyk explained the procedure for adding these liens to the properties, will be done by resolution, property owners will be notified giving them advance notice of the meeting so they have another chance to rectify the situation. Three properties have been identified; however, the decision was that the funding for the cleanup of these properties would come out of Buildings and Grounds; this will postpone repairs to Borough Hall.
