## **Discussion**

## Owen Kruger Eagle Scout Project at Butler Municipal Building Playground

Mr. Kruger contacted Mr. Rodriguez of the Butler Library stating that he had a conflict this evening, it will be carried to the October 1, 2019 Workshop meeting.

Ceremonial Flags – Katie O'Neill, 72 Bartholdi Avenue Ms. O'Neill noted that many municipalities are flying the Pride Flag, she feels that putting the flag shows acceptance. Council President Verdonik explained that he does not want to open the door for "bad elements" to come in to request flying flags that some residents may find offensive. Ms. O'Neill feels that that is a political party issue, both Councilman Regis and Travers objected, as they do not believe that is the opinion of the Council members in the room. Councilman Travers explained that he does not want to open the door for any individual who may spread something that is hateful. Councilman Calvi explained that he does not want to open the door for other groups by party, who could provide the same arguments and the Borough would have no choice but to honor the request. Should the Borough not honor the request this could potentially result in litigation, he feels that the current flags flying will continue being flown, he also feels that we are all people and citizens of the United States. Councilman Fox noted that the discussion is on ceremonial flags, not just the Pride flag. Council President Verdonik noted that Butler is a small, diverse and tightly knit community; he feels that no one should be painted with a broad brush based on party affiliation. He complimented Ms. O'Neill on her flying the Pride flag on her property as it shows Butler as a welcoming town. Council President Verdonik asked Mr. Oostdyk if the Borough flies one flag does this mean they have to fly all flags for which they receive a request. Mr. Oostdyk explained that you would not be able to deny the request based on the like or dislike of the organization or its message. Councilman Regis noted that his concern is that litigation will arise because of a denial to fly a particular flag. Councilman Meier expressed his feeling that the flags currently flying should be the only ones flown. Mr. Lampmann noted that if the State or Federal Government makes a determination regarding what flags may be flown this would set a standard for local governments.

At the request of Mayor Alviene, the Council was polled on flying ceremonial flags:

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Councilmembers expressed that while they are voting no at this time, they would not be averse to revisiting this later, they also asked that Ms. O'Neill request the Pride Proclamation next year.

and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all

such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the

provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or

all of the notes at not less than par from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them

to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price. The Chief Financial

Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body of the Borough at the meeting next

succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes hereunder is made. Such report must

include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and

the name of the purchaser.

Section 27. Any note issued pursuant to this resolution shall be a general

obligation of the Borough, and the Borough's faith and credit are hereby pledged to the punctual

payment of the principal of and interest on the notes and, unless otherwise paid or payment

provided for, an amount sufficient for such payment shall be inserted in the budget and a tax

sufficient to provide for the payment thereof shall be levied and collected.

Section 28. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized and directed to do

all other matters necessary, useful, convenient or desirable to accomplish the delivery of the notes

to the purchasers thereof as promptly as possible, including (i) the preparation, execution and

dissemination of a Preliminary Official Statement and Final Official Statement with respect to the

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notes, (ii) preparation, distribution and publication, if necessary, of a Notice of Sale with respect to the notes, (iii) execution of a Continuing Disclosure Undertaking, with respect to the notes in accordance with Rule 15c2 12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission and (iv) execution of an arbitrage and use of proceeds certificate certifying that, among other things, the Borough, to the extent it is empowered and allowed under applicable law, will do and perform all acts and things necessary or desirable to assure that interest paid on the notes is not included in gross income under Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

All action heretofore taken by Borough officials and professionals with regard to the sale and award of the notes is hereby ratified, confirmed, adopted and approved.
